Fergus Fireman Dies Fighting Fire

Daniel C. Ness Collapses and Dies at Concrete Plant Fire

A Fergus Falls fireman died at 3:30 a. m. today while fighting a fire at the Elk River Concrete plant, a block east of the Northern Pacific station.

Dan Ness, 65 years old, collapsed at the scene of the fire and died in a few minutes, apparently from a heart attack. Other firemen used a resuscitator almost immediately to no avail.

The oldest member of the fire Services for department, Mr. Ness had been a volunteer since March 11, 1918. He is believed to be the first Fergus Falls fireman to die while

Firemen were summoned at 2:-27 a.m., when a man arriving at his home in the neighborhood noticed flames on the roof of the structure. The roof was destroyed and there was damage to the elevator used for gravel and to several hundred sacks of cement.

Firemen were uncertain whether lightning or the furnace used to dry gravel was the cause of the fire. A wall of the building was burned from the ground near the furnace to the roof. Exterior of the building is covered with aluminum sheeting. There was no damage to an addition east of the taller structure,

Five trucks answered the call with the last truck returning at 5:55 a.m. At 9:51 p.m. yesterday firemen were called to the 300 Norway July 4, 1888, and came to block on West Alcott when lightning caused damage to a power line.

Fire Chief Harvey Glorvigen said firemen were preparing to take in some of the hoses at 3:30 s.m., when a car accidentally ran over a hose. Mr. Ness ran toward the car to warn the driv- survive. er, then walked back toward the concrete plant.

Only a few seconds later he noticed Mr. Ness lying on the lodge. ground. He called other firemen and they immediately applied the resuscitator and summoned a doctor. He was dead soon after the doctor arrived.

He was married to Anne Otteson at Wolverton June 2, 1917, at Moorhead. She and four children


Mr. Ness leved hunting and fishing and outdoor life. He was a Mason and a member of the Elks
